

Request for Application (RFA) for Seed grant from Manipal McGill Center for Infectious Diseases (MAC ID) for the year 2016-2017

Description of the Seed Grant Program:

The goal of Manipal McGill Center for Infectious Diseases (MAC ID) seed grant award is to encourage faculty members of MU in research in the area of infectious diseases and generate a critical mass of fundamental information/pilot data which can further help the investigators to develop proposals for extramural funding. Proposals must show a clear plan to seek further funding after the seed grant period has ended. The applicant must clearly and convincingly demonstrate that the proposed project represents a research direction in an area likely to generate extramural funding.

Seed grants of **INR 1 lakh** each will be awarded to deserving proposals. Grants are non-renewable. Duration of the seed grant projects should be a maximum of 12 months. 8 grants would be awarded in the first year.

Eligibility

- The principal investigator must be a member of MAC ID and a faculty of Manipal University; the co investigators may be member/non-member.
- Seed grant is open to all areas of Infectious Diseases
- Duration of project should be for a maximum of 1 year
- A MAC ID member can submit one seed grant application as the principal-investigator; However can be a co-investigator in other grant applications

Ineligible projects:

- Research that is already supported by other sources
- Gap funding to bridge support between external grants or contracts.

Time lines:

- Call for proposals open: 3/9/2016
- Application submission due date: 29/10/2016, 17:00 hours
- Review of applications: November/December 2016
- Announcement of awards: 2nd week of December 2016
- Grant money will be released on submission of Ethics committee approval certificate
- Project may start after Ethics committee approval but not later than and March 2017

CVs of the investigators with relevant publications and grants of last 5 years must be attached.	

How to submit the proposal?

How will proposals be judged?

A peer review committee consisting of Manipal and McGill faculty will evaluate the applications as per the scoring system for selection of awardees.

Applications will be scored on:

Grant Administration

The fund will be held at MU finance, earmarked for the awardee. The utilization of the fund will have to follow MU guidelines. Purchase request has to be placed through online purchase system routed through MAC ID for approval, for the purchase of the required material.

Final Reporting

1. Within two months of the close of the project a statement of expenditure must be submitted to the MAC ID. A template will be provided.

Normal research expenditures including supplies, salaries for research personnel, are permitted. **Funds should not be used to** (a) purchase equipment, (b) cover travel expenses related to conferences (c) support salary of PIs or co-applicants

2. Within two months of the close of the project a brief scientific report must be submitted to the MAC ID. The results of the pilot study must be published in Scopus indexed scientific journals. The award money may be utilized for publication charges. The seed grant support from Manipal McGill Center for Infectious Diseases must be acknowledged in publications.
3. Seed grantees must produce a new proposal for extramural funding as the final report within one year of completion of the project.
